<u>Series Summary</u>: The author of Hebrews aims to convince his Jewish audience of one main truth: Jesus is better. This portion of Hebrews is written to inspire lifelong faithfulness to Jesus, well past our initial emotional decision.

Hebrews 3:2-6, ² He was faithful to the one who appointed him, just as Moses was faithful in all God's house.³ Jesus has been found worthy of greater honor than Moses, just as the builder of a house has greater honor than the house itself. ⁴ For every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything. ⁵ "Moses was faithful as a servant in all God's house," bearing witness to what would be spoken by God in the future. ⁶ But Christ is faithful as the Son over God's house. And we are his house, if indeed we hold firmly to our confidence and the hope in which we glory.

Jesus is BETTER THAN: Your Faithfulness

- Moses showed amazing faithfulness in his ministry, but Jesus showed a perfect faithfulness.
- True commitment to Jesus is demonstrated over the long term, not just in an initial burst of emotion to start.
- If Moses' faith wasn't enough, then how can we possibly have a faith that perseveres?
- The most important thing to remember is, "Christ is faithful" (3:6)
- In the next few verses, the author is going to show his readers why else it's possible to continue to believe.

Hebrews 3:7-11, ⁷ So, as the Holy Spirit says: "Today, if you hear his voice, ⁸ do not harden your hearts as you did…in the wilderness, ⁹ where your ancestors tested and tried me, though for forty years they saw what I did…¹¹ So I declared on oath in my anger, 'They shall never enter my rest.'"

#1 Faith perseveres: with a heart of gratitude

- "Today" (3:7) means this is still a real invitation from God to you!
- "...they saw what I did..." = Israel saw, but did not remember with gratitude, so their memories were poisoned.
- Gratitude reminds us to trust in God based on his past faithfulness in our lives.

<u>Hebrews 3:12-13</u>, ¹² See to it, brothers and sisters, that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God. ¹³ But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called "Today," so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness.

#2 Faith perseveres: with the help of others

- Unbelief is not inability to understand, but unwillingness to trust. It is the will, not intelligence, that is involved.
- Persevering in faith is a community project!
- If we want to have faith that lasts, we must be around other believers who will encourage & challenge unbelief!

<u>Hebrews 4:1; 9-11, 1</u> ...let us be careful that none of you be found to have fallen short of it... 9 There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God; 10 for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his. 11 Let us, therefore, make every effort to enter that rest...

#3 Faith perseveres: with healthy fear & effort

- What do we fear? Unbelief! -- "fallen short" (4:1)
- This cessation from works as a basis for righteousness fulfills our "sabbath rest", but we still pursue good works!
- We rest securely on what Christ has done for us!
- The rest is there, but God does not force it upon us. We must "make every effort to enter that rest" (4:11).

<u>Hebrews 4:12</u>, ¹² For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

#4 Faith perseveres: with time spent in God's Word

God's Word shows us His heart and His way, as well as our heart and our way!

• Our faith grows as we listen, read & discuss the Word: Romans 10:17, faith comes from hearing the message...

Hebrews 4:14-16, ¹⁴ ...since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. ¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. ¹⁶ Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

#5 Faith perseveres: only with mercy, grace & help of God

- The only way we are able to "hold firmly to the faith" (4:14) is "since we have a great high priest" (4:14)
- If we are faithless, he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself. 2 Timothy 2:13
- "empathize with our weaknesses" (4:15) = Jesus understands our situation. He's been there.
- "with confidence" (4:16) means we can: pray constantly, about anything, trusting that God hears, without using super religious words, and without a reservation.
- There is only benefit in coming to Jesus in prayer:
 - We obtain mercy (this is not getting what we deserve).
 - We find grace (this is getting what we don't deserve).
- Philippians 1:6, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion...
