PRESSURE POINTS: What Does Rich Look Like?

James 5:1-6, 1 Now listen, you rich people, weep and wail because of the misery that is coming on you. 2 Your wealth has rotted, and moths have eaten your clothes. 3 Your gold & silver are corroded. Their corrosion will testify against you and eat your flesh like fire. You have hoarded wealth in the last days. 4 Look! The wages you failed to pay the workers who mowed your fields are crying out against you. The cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord Almighty. 5 You have lived on earth in luxury and self-indulgence. You have fattened yourselves in the day of slaughter. 6 You have condemned and murdered the innocent one, who was not opposing you.

PRINCIPLES ON WEALTH FROM JAMES 5:1-6

Wealth can be a tool for good or a trap that consumes.

- Proverbs 10:22 God gives wealth to His people as a blessing.
- 1 Timothy 6:18 God gives wealth so that we can in turn bless others.
- Matthew 19:21-26 Yet there are added difficulties for the rich (like the deceitfulness of money).

When pleasure becomes excess, it turns into sin.

- 1 Timothy 6:17b God wants us to enjoy the blessings He has given us.
- The problem is that over-indulgence causes us to lose capacity and passion for helping the less fortunate.

Hoarding money is not the same as wisely saving.

- The Bible instructs us to budget, give, save, invest, but not to hoard.
- Jesus warned about greed & hoarding in Luke 12:13-21.

Wealth doesn't offer the lasting security we assume it does.

- Proverbs 11:28 Scripture warns us to not trust in riches.
- 1 Timothy 6:17a We get to choose if we put our trust in uncertain riches, or in a faithful God.

A love for money often leads us into deeper sins.

- Proverbs 16:8 Making money appropriately is something God cares a lot about.
- Malachi 3:7-11 Withholding from God leads to a surprise sin: robbing God!

Don't silence the Spirit's conviction about your money.

- Don't ignore moments of compassion or spontaneous generosity this week.
- 1 John 3:17 True believers will respond to real needs, secretly.

Without Jesus as our main love, the future brings fear.

- Money functions as a test for what we truly love. Our receipts show us what we love: Matthew 6:19
- Luke 16:19-31 The "rich" man who ignored Lazarus in this story paid for it!

We're running out of time to invest in God's work.

- "In the last days" speaks of Jesus coming back as a thief in the night!
- James references that, or our limited time on earth, or a missed opportunity for generosity. Don't miss it!

HOW CAN WE APPLY THIS PRACTICALLY?

- 15% of Jesus' teaching are about money, but only 7% of the sermons at Cornerstone are, so don't panic :)
