Revelations 2:12-17, 12 "To the angel of the church in Pergamum write:

These are the words of him who has the sharp, double-edged sword. 13 I know where you live—where Satan has his throne. Yet you remain true to my name. You did not renounce your faith in me, not even in the days of Antipas, my faithful witness, who was put to death in your city—where Satan lives.

14 Nevertheless, I have a few things against you: There are some among you who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to entice the Israelites to sin so that they are food sacrificed to idols and committed sexual immorality. 15 Likewise, you also have those who hold to the teaching of the Nicolaitans. 16 Repent therefore! Otherwise, I will soon come to you and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.

17 Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give some of the hidden manna. I will also give that person a white stone with a new namewritten on it, known only to the one who receives it.

Practical Application: What can we do today?

- Anchor yourself in truth: Pick one promise or passage from Scripture that speaks to your life right now. Memorize it, meditate on it, or set it as a daily reminder.
- **Listen to the Spirit:** Take 5–10 minutes today to pray, reflect, or journal and ask God, 'Where are you guiding me? What do I need to hear?' Commit to obey one small step today."
